BRHS Honors Math Overview

- -Faster-paced and deeper coverage than Academic courses
- -Emphasis on the following:
 - -Understanding over memorization
 - -"Big picture" over knowledge of single chapters/units
- -Lots of independent/partner work and discovery activities
- -Self-discipline, time management, and organization required
- -Gateway to Advanced Placement® (AP®) Math Courses

Advanced Placement® (AP®)



- -Typically taken in later years at BRHS
- -Equivalent of college-level courses (mostly first year level)*
- -TI-84 (or higher) graphing calculator HIGHLY recommended
- -Very fast-paced particularly due to AP® Exams in early May
 - -Covers cumulative course material
 - -*You can potentially earn college credit based on your AP® Exam score!

Advice from Freshmen Honors Students (1/2)



- -Budget your time and be organized!
- -Extra credit is not guaranteed.
- -There are fewer quizzes and tests (but each is worth more).
- -Grades correspond to understanding over effort.
- -Take ownership in your learning.

Advice from Freshmen Honors Students (2/2)



- -"Fun and interesting does NOT equate to easy."
- -"You will actually need to study!"
- -"Honors Geometry may not always be a clear representation of your success at BRHS."
- -"Have fun and enjoy the ride!"

Advice from Teachers



- -Always check Google Classroom and PowerSchool!
 - -Install on smartphone (if possible) and turn on notifications!
- -Focus on independent thinking over memorization.
- -Use class/homework/study time wisely, and stay organized.
- -Study by **PRACTICING** as opposed to "reading" over material!
- -Do NOT be afraid to ask questions and ask for help! :)
 - -If you need extra help, set up an appointment with your teacher right away (don't wait until test/quiz time).
